

# 7 Tips to Keep Your Property in Compliance with Local Codes



## 1 Keep weeds and grasses trimmed

Weeds and grass are not permitted to grow higher than 8 inches.

## 2 Properly dispose of "junk"


Junk is any discarded material not intended for immediate use. This can include derelict vehicles, metal, glass, weeds, lumber, grass, branches, construction debris, appliances, building material, and salvage/scrap material. See code for extensive information on derelict vehicles.

## 3 Follow trash container and litter laws

- Trash must be placed in and remain in the container until pick-up.
- All trash must be bagged in an appropriate bag.
- All trash must be in a bin.
- Lid must close on bin to prevent animal scavenging.



## 4 Alleys and sidewalks are the responsibility of the property owner

City ordinances also apply to alleys, sidewalks, utility easements, and right-of-ways and must be maintained by the adjacent property owner

## 5 Green waste must be removed

Tree limbs, branches, grass clippings, leaves and other green waste must be disposed of properly. Green waste can be disposed free at landfill. No garbage or refuse may be burned within the city.

Noises and odors can also be nuisances. Actions, noises or items that disturb the peace or are offensively stinky are also nuisances.

## 7 Keep in mind what can be discarded at no charge

Metal, green waste, limbs/branches, grass, and clean dirt may be disposed of at the landfill at no charge. Aluminum cans, cardboard, paperboard, clear plastics #1, colored plastics #2, milk jugs, clear and brown glass containers, clean steel cans, newspapers and inserts, office paper, and magazines can be recycled.
