Frequently Asked Questions



Did City Council meetings change times?

Yes, the Rawlins City Council has updated its regular meeting schedule! Regular meetings now start at 6:00 p.m. on the first and third Tuesdays of each month (previously 7:30 p.m.) at City Hall, 521 W. Cedar St. City Council work sessions will now typically be held immediately following the Council meeting.

The change to the meeting time was made to better support community participation, provide more flexibility for scheduling, and help avoid late evening sessions. Updates made to Rawlins Municipal Code 2.04.010 also clarify how work sessions and special meetings are scheduled, while continuing to meet all requirements of the Wyoming Open Meetings Act.

How can I bring an item to City Council?

To request an item be placed on the agenda, contact Lynn Shearer, City Clerk, at 307-328-4500, ext. 1001, or lshearer@rawlinswy.gov. The deadline for submission of all agenda items is by Tuesday, 8:00 am, the week prior to the next scheduled council meeting. At each regular council meeting, there is an item called Citizen's Participation, which is set by Resolution to allow the public to speak directly to the council for up to 5 minutes on any item not found on the agenda.

Can I review the information in the Council packet?

Yes, all items presented for Council review are available at www.rawlinswy.gov/boarddocs, typically by the Friday prior to the meeting. If you would prefer to review a hard copy, please stop by City Hall during regular hours or call Lynn Shearer, City Clerk at 307-328-4500 ext. 1001.





HANDY TIPS TO AVOID FROZEN PIPES THIS WINTER



Frozen pipes can leave you without water, and if they break, are expensive to repair. Prevent frozen pipes by taking steps now!

BEFORE COLD WEATHER



Drain and turn off all outdoor water lines.



Fix drafty windows and doors.



Seal at pipe openings to stop cold air.



Know how to shut off your water.



Wrap your pipes in insulation, especially in cold, drafty places.



Install heat tape, or check existing to make sure it is functional and in good shape.

DURING SEVERE COLD



Keep the thermostat above 55 degrees F.



Allow inside faucets to trickle. This makes it more difficult for water to freeze.



Open kitchen and bathroom cabinet doors to give plumbing access to warm air.



Check your heat tape.

IF YOUR PIPES DO FREEZE



Shut off water into the home immediately.



Keep the faucet open.



Apply heat with hair dryer, electric heating pad, or portable space heater.



Do not leave space heaters unattended or use open flames.



Need help? Call a licensed plumber.



Once pipes are thawed, slowly turn water back on and check for cracks or leaks.
